Goals for Mentees: 80% attendance rate each year; reduction in referrals, detentions, OSS, ISS to a perfect goal of zero; increased and passing grades, class ranking improvement over the course of high school; career exploration opportunities, life skills, and ultimately, high school graduation.

Target Population: males & females, high-needs students recommended from guidance, teachers, parents, administrators. Students with attendance, grade and behavior issues.
